### **MFL curriculum map**

French is taught for twenty five minutes each week, with the exception of one week each term when there is a house or school event in the afternoon. 11 lessons autumn term, 10 lessons in the spring and summer term. Children in Key stage 2 have 15.5 hours of discrete French lessons each year.
